

What does the British Consulate-General in Barcelona do?

The British Consulate-General in Barcelona represents the UK government and provides services to British nationals in Catalonia, Aragon and Andorra.

What we CAN do*

✓ Issue Emergency Travel Documents (for replacing lost, stolen, damaged, expired or unavailable passports to travel) [See next page for details].

- ✓ Notarial and documentary services (e.g. for getting married in Spain). See the full list of <u>notarial and</u> documentary services we provide.
- ✓ Bereavement support (Read our <u>guidance on</u> <u>bereavement</u> following the death of a British national in Spain).
- Support and advice to victims and their family/friends.
- ✓ Support if you've been arrested or detained.
- ✓ Provide information about transferring funds.
- Provide appropriate help if you have suffered <u>rape</u> or serious assault, are a <u>victim of other crime</u>, or are in hospital.
- ✓ Help people with mental illness.
- ✓ Offer support and help in a range of other cases, such as <u>child abductions</u>, <u>missing people</u> and <u>kidnapping</u>.
- ✓ Contact family or friends for you if you want.
- Make special arrangements in cases of <u>terrorism</u>, civil disturbances or natural disasters or other <u>crises</u> <u>abroad</u>.

What we CAN NOT do


- Issue Full Valid Passports or help with passport enquiries. Contact <u>Her Majesty's Passport Office</u> if you need help.
- Issue visas or help with visa enquiries (see <u>UK visas</u> and immigration).
- Register a birth or death (how to <u>register a birth</u> or <u>register a death</u> in Spain).
- ★ Legalise documents (certify as genuine) (get a UK document legalised).
- **Help you enter a country**, for example, if you don't have a visa or your passport is not valid.
- Give you legal advice, investigate crimes or carry out searches for missing people.
- **Get you better treatment** in hospital or prison than is given to local people.
- Get people out of prison or intervene with the Spanish system/authority.
- **×** Pay any bills or give you money.
- Make travel arrangements for you, or find you work or accommodation.
- Make business arrangements on your behalf.
