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Our Offerings



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Our offerings

Manchester United Foundation's education programme offers a wide range of active, fun, and engaging sessions, all built around the theme of football to inspire learning. Our aim is to inspire and educate children through fun, active learning experiences that spark curiosity and build confidence.

We deliver tailored Maths, English, and PSHE lessons designed specifically for primary education, ensuring pupils gain valuable skills in an enjoyable and memorable way. In addition, we provide bespoke Physical Education CPD sessions for teaching staff, shaped around the individual needs of each school to enhance confidence and practice in delivering high quality PE.

All sessions have been carefully created by our skilled staff, trialled successfully in schools with children, and proven to have a positive impact. Alongside our own programmes, we also deliver sessions developed through the Premier League Primary Stars initiative, further enriching the educational experience and ensuring schools benefit from nationally recognised resources.



English activities

- **Creative Writing Captains** – A creative writing intervention designed for children who can write but lack motivation or enjoyment. Using the exciting theme of football, pupils will explore a variety of writing styles such as; designing their own comic strip, crafting a comeback story, completing book reviews, motivational team talks, scout reports, and match reports. This fun, football-focused approach helps children discover new ways to express themselves, build confidence, and develop a genuine enthusiasm for writing.

KS2 – Small group or whole class – 45min to 1 hour – one-off lesson or six-week intervention

- **Fred’s Book Club** – This Book Club is designed for children who can read but struggle to enjoy it. The programme challenges pupils to complete a “Ten Book Challenge,” exploring titles from different authors to help them discover new favourites and spark excitement around reading. By broadening their experiences and making reading fun, the intervention aims to build confidence, motivation, and a lasting love of books.

KS2 – Small group – 30min – six-week intervention

- **World Book Day / Reading Celebration Day** – We are offering exciting World Book Day sessions for pupils from nursery age through to year six. These active, game-based sessions, use famous children’s books to bring stories to life in fun and engaging ways. By combining literacy with interactive play, the sessions create a memorable experience that inspires a love of reading and ensures World Book Day is one the children will never forget.

EYFS to KS2 – whole class – 45 mins – one-off session



English activities

- **PLPS Story Stars** – This storytelling intervention is designed to spark excitement around reading for young children. In these sessions, pupils don't just listen to a story they actively join in by acting out scenes, answering questions, and predicting what might happen next. This interactive approach makes reading fun, engaging, and memorable, helping children develop a love of books in the most enjoyable way.

EYFS to KS1 – Small group or whole class – 15mins – one-off lesson

- **United's Comprehension Club** - A comprehension intervention designed to support children who need help with developing basic comprehension skills. Using the inspiring story of Manchester United legend Marcus Rashford, pupils will explore his journey from grassroots footballer to England international. The engaging content motivates learners, while structured activities build confidence in reading and understanding texts, making comprehension both meaningful and enjoyable.

KS2 – Small group – 30min to 45min – six-week intervention



Maths activities

- **Manchester United Times Table** – An active maths multiplication intervention designed for children who find multiplication challenging. Through fun, movement-based lessons, pupils practise and learn their times tables in an engaging and active way. This approach builds confidence, reinforces key skills, and helps children develop a positive attitude towards maths by making learning both enjoyable and memorable.

KS2 – small group – 30min to 45min - six-week intervention

- **National Numeracy Day / Maths Celebration Day** – We are offering engaging National Numeracy Day sessions for pupils from nursery age through to year six. These active maths lessons are designed to be fun, memorable, and tailored to each year group, with children exploring different mathematical operations in ways that suit their stage of learning. The sessions bring maths to life, helping pupils build confidence, enjoyment, and a lasting positive attitude towards the subject.

EYFS to KS2 – whole class – 45 mins – one-off session

- **PLPS Career Mode** -The Premier League Primary Stars Career Mode programme is designed as a targeted intervention for maths - split into six lessons - to reinforce learning pupils have already covered in regular numeracy lessons. These fun and engaging sessions encourage teamwork and a squad mentality, embedding key mathematical concepts alongside essential life skills such as problem solving, budgeting, planning and resilience.

Upper KS2 – Small group – 45min - six-week intervention



PHSE activities

- **Transition Group** – A transition to high school intervention designed to support year six pupils who may feel nervous about moving into year seven. Developed with input from high school students and teachers, the sessions gently introduce children to the changes and similarities they will encounter, including timetables, making new friends, the journey to school, essential items, and typical high school scenarios. This supportive programme helps ease worries, build confidence, and prepare pupils for a successful start to secondary school.

Year six – Small group or whole class – 30 to 45min – six-week intervention

- **Internet Safety** - A one-off internet safety intervention designed specifically for primary-aged children. The session introduces pupils to key topics such as understanding people online, recognising age restrictions, and practising safe online behaviour. It concludes with an engaging quiz to reinforce learning, ensuring children leave with practical knowledge and confidence to navigate the digital world safely.

KS2 – Small group or whole class – 45min – one-off lesson

- **Mini Medics** – This first aid intervention designed to teach primary-aged children the basics of first aid and CPR. Through engaging, age-appropriate activities, pupils will learn essential skills that build confidence in responding to everyday accidents and emergencies. This practical programme not only equips children with valuable life skills but also promotes responsibility, safety awareness, and care for others.

KS2 – Small group or whole class – 45min – one-off lesson or six-week intervention



PHSE activities

- **PLPS No Room for Racism featuring Jamie Johnson** – The Premier League is committed to ending racism in football and the wider society. This pack uses the BBC Jamie Johnson series to explore what racism can look like, its causes, and how to fight racism by promoting and supporting diversity and inclusion. In this pack, pupils will make a commitment to promoting inclusion and diversity in their school and community through taking a pledge.

KS2 – Small group or whole class – 45min – one-off lesson

- **PLPS No Room For Racism: Greatness Comes From Everywhere** - This lesson supports pupils in understanding and celebrating diversity, using the Premier League No Room For Racism campaign to champion inclusion. Through literacy and writing, pupils are challenged to be creative and demonstrate how the theme 'Greatness Comes From Everywhere' can be embodied through poetry. The lesson features inspiring quotes from the Premier League and the No Room For Racism campaign as well as a range of example poetry forms.

KS2 – Small group or whole class – 45min – one-off lesson



PHSE activities

- **Be Kind** - Our kindness intervention is a fun and interactive session designed to help children explore what kindness really means and why it matters. Through engaging discussions, pupils learn the power of kindness, discover practical ways to be kind at school and at home, and understand how small acts can make a big difference. The session ends with an exciting Kindness Bingo challenge, encouraging children to put their learning into action and spread positivity throughout their community.

KS1/2 – Small group or whole class – 45min to 1 hour - one off lesson

- **Dentistry** Our Dentistry Intervention is an engaging session designed by qualified dentists to help children understand what a dentist does and why regular visits are important. Pupils learn the names of different teeth and discover simple, practical ways to keep them healthy through good oral hygiene. To make the experience even more impactful, every child receives their own toothbrush and toothpaste to take home, reinforcing the importance of daily dental care. This interactive session ensures children leave with both knowledge and the tools to maintain a healthy smile.

KS1/2 – whole class – 1 hour - one off lesson



Staff CPD

- **PE CPD sessions** - We are offering a tailored physical education staff meeting designed to meet the specific needs of your school. The session can focus on areas such as planning and delivering PE lessons, engaging children effectively, using the STEP framework, assessing progress, or any other aspect your teachers would like to be upskilled on. This flexible approach ensures staff gain practical strategies and confidence to deliver high quality PE that inspires and benefits all pupils.

Costings



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Costings and sessions break down

When you select one of these packages, a qualified member from Manchester United Foundation will visit your school to deliver tailored sessions of your choice.

£250 for a half day, one-off delivery (up to three classes)

- We'll visit your school for a morning or afternoon session, delivering an intervention of your choice for up to three classes or groups.

£250 for a half day teacher PE CPD session

- We'll visit your school for a morning or afternoon session, working closely with teaching staff to strengthen their PE knowledge and confidence. This flexible option can be used as a dedicated half day for teacher training, making it an ideal choice for INSET or trust days.

£400 for a full day of one-off delivery (up to six classes)

- We'll visit your school for a full day to deliver interventions of your choice for up to six classes or groups.

£1,500 for a six-week block of half day interventions (up to three classes)

- Our team will visit your school for a morning or afternoon session each week over a six-weeks period, delivering an intervention of your choice to the same three classes or groups.

£2,400 for a six-week block of full day interventions (up to six classes)

- Our team will visit your school for one full day each week over a six-week period, delivering an intervention of your choice to the same six classes or groups
